Penyabong Beach, which is about 36 km from Mersing city, offers tourists a variety of attractions and activities. Examples are boating, kayaking, fishing, camping, and hiking through neighbouring forests. A kelong (fish farm) can be visited on the way back after visiting the Malay towns nearby or the island. Four seaside resorts provide both affordable lodging and moderately priced meeting spaces. Visitors can also find refreshment stands, rest huts, restrooms, and showers. Rentable gear for paddling, canoeing, fishing, and other water sports is available at a sea sports centre, making a trip to Penyabong Beach fun. Additionally, the Penyabong region has been designated as a tourist location.

TOPONOMY

A Terengganu native by the name of Harun is the source of this mountain's history. He was the first to discover the mountain's summit. Harun goes by Arong because he is from Terengganu. That is where the name Gunung Arong comes from. According to the evidence provided by the villagers, the Terengganu residents did actually open the Tanjung Resang region. Terengganu continues to be the region with the largest population (Nuaris, 2010).

LOCATION

Location of Gunung Arong in Johor, with an elevation of 898 feet, this mountain ranks third-lowest in the State of Johor. Tanjung Resang, Mersing, is where Mount Arong is situated. This hill is called a mountain since it is the tallest landmark in the Tanjung Resang region. All parts of Tanjung Resang can see this peak plainly. One hundred fifty-one miles from Johor Bahru and connected to Endau and Mersing via the Mersing-Endau route.

ACTIVITIES

In a research setting, rivers, camping, hiking, and mountain climbing. A spectacular view can be had from the top of Mount Arong in the Mersing district's forest reserve, one of the city's top attractions for those who appreciate the natural beauty. Climbing Mount Arong is an option for those who enjoy practicing extreme sports.

Pasir Lanun Beach is said to get its name from the story of pirates who robbed merchant ships in the South China Sea and hid the loot in a cave on the beach. It is even believed that it is still there today, but no one dares to explore it because some of it has been buried. (Utusan Malaysia, June 3, 2010)



ATTRACTION

The beach area is ideal for relaxing with the family. The view from Pasir Lanun Beach that shows Aceh Island is very interesting not to mention that visitors can take a boat provided by the chalet operator to go to the island. There is also a kelong that is very popular with anglers because there are many species of fish such as ebek, jemuduk, jenhong and others.

The village of Air Papan is a seaside area with a 3 km (1.9 mi) long beach set between the hills in Mersing District, Johor, Malaysia.

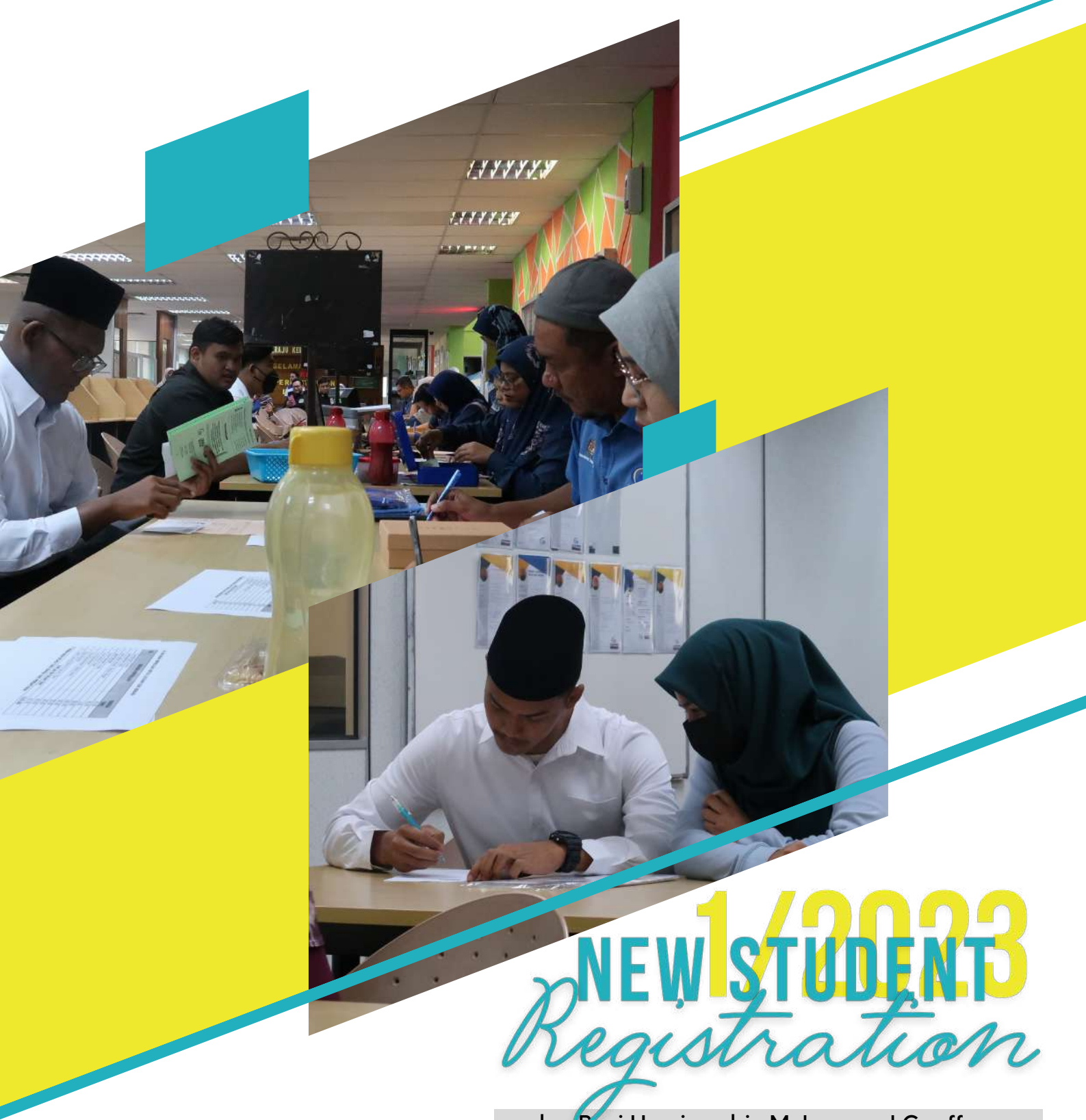
ACTIVITIES

Human Resource Management Information System (HRMIS), or commonly known as the Sistem Maklumat Pengurusan Sumber Manusia in Malay, is the single system of public sector human resource management in Malaysia. It is an application system that covers all aspects of human resource management from the appointment of civil servants until they retire.

The HRMIS official website features FAQs (Development; Termination of Service; Career Management; Communication Management & Discipline; Performance Management; Personal Records Management; Management Remuneration, Benefits and Rewards; Competency Assessment; System Administration; Information Services; Procurement of Human Resources), Download (HRMIS Module and Sub-Module), Corporate information and Standard Operating Procedures (EG * Net Application, Application Server Training, Policy Implementation, Customer Service).

Therefore, a workshop on how to create myPortfolio through the HRMIS application was held on 8 February 2023 in Makmal Berlian. myPortfolio is a knowledge management method that emphasises the empowerment of the mind of every civil servant within the framework of a learning organisation. In addition to being an official reference document that describes the information on the creation of positions, the work process and guidelines for carrying out tasks for those positions in an organisation are also specified in myPortfolio.

All staff who attended the workshop were taught step by step to create their individual myPortfolio. The instructions given were crystal clear; hence at the end of the workshop, almost all staff managed to generate their myPortfolio from the HRMIS application. It is hoped that the myPortfolio created will serve as a guide for all staff.
